The Haka is a traditional dance form of the South Pacific islander mostly known from the Māori of New Zealand through their rugby team display. It is a posture dance performed by a group, with vigorous movements and stamping of the feet with rhythmically shouted accompaniment.

The boys have been learning The Haka as part of their Building Learning Power lessons.

After the performances, the students were awarded their certificates, either bronze, silver or gold, for their work this year.
